



FAMILY CAMP – HELPFUL INFORMATION

Registration

Registration takes place from **2:30pm to 5:00pm** on the Sunday your session starts. Supper is at 5:30. If you anticipate late arrival, please call or email the office. Camp ends the next Saturday after breakfast. Motel rooms need to be vacated by 10:00 am to prepare for the next session; guests are welcome to stay and enjoy the beach, but may not re-enter rooms after that time.

Meals

Meals are served in the dining room at 8:30, 12:30, and 5:30. High chairs and booster seats are provided. Those who have indicated special dietary needs may speak to the dining room hostess concerning a special meal. There is a fridge available in the main lounge for guest use for those bringing soya milk, etc. – please label your items. Dinner Friday night is a smorgasbord – children 4-11 will have a special meal and program in the main lounge. Trailer park guests may purchase a meal plan, or individual meals with 24 hrs. notice.

Waterfront & Recreational Facilities

There are many options for you to use in free time – mini-golf, disc golf, canoes & kayaks, basketball, volleyball, etc. All recreational equipment is supplied. Activities requiring staff facilitation are on your weekly schedule – challenge course (low ropes), ‘Joy Belle’ (pontoon boat) rides, archery, riflery, and trips to the rock cliff across the lake. Qualified lifeguards man the waterfront at designated times; when the red flag is up, lifeguards are *off* duty, and you may swim at your own risk. Paddles, lifejackets, and boating safety kits are available in the Shore Shack. All program offerings are included in your registration fee except for water-skiing/tubing/wake-boarding, for which there is a small pay-per-use fee. We will also have stand-up paddle board rentals available.

There is an opportunity to join a group for golfing at a local course each Tuesday; bring your own clubs if interested, or you can rent at the course.

Guests bringing motor boats must register with the office, provide proof of insurance, and comply with provincial regulations.

Children’s & Teen Programs

Classes for all ages are held during morning chapel – Wee-Care nursery for 0-3 years, Kingdom Kids for 4-6 years, and classes for 7-11 and teens 12 and up. Nursery programs are offered twice a week during evening chapels, and there will be special kids’ and teen evening campfires.

What-to-Bring

Dress is casual. Please bring modest, family-appropriate swimwear. No bare feet or bathing suits allowed in dining room. Some people like to dress up a bit for Smorgasbord on Friday night.

Linens and towels are provided except for those staying in Cedar Lodge. Fresh towels are provided mid-week. Please bring extra towels for the beach. A coin laundry is available on site. Playpens are available for children 2 and under. Motel rooms have soap provided, but not shampoo or hair dryers.

What-not-to-Bring

Please don’t bring alcohol or illegal substances. Don’t bring nut products, in consideration of guests with allergies. Smoking is not permitted in the rooms - outdoor ashtrays are available. Pets are not allowed – we recommend a local kennel – www.clearwaterkennels.ca

Internet Policy

Wireless internet is available on site for checking email and limited usage, ie not streaming or large downloads.

Tuck Shop & Spin Shop

The tuck shop is open for snacks after chapel each morning, from 3:00 - 4:30 each afternoon, and after chapel at night. Families may open an account to avoid carrying cash around. Camp clothing and novelties are available in the Spin Shop, open several days each week.
